The Bidding Prayer

Officiant: Beloved friends, I bid you welcome in the name of the One who is God almighty, the God of wisdom, loving-kindness and grace, whose face is known to us all in the wonders of creation. For God, indeed, is the creator, redeemer, and sustainer of us and all that is. ***Amen.***

Let us recall the story of God's love in creation, keeping in mind this fragile earth, our island home, which sustains all life. Let us rejoice together in all the creatures of the earth, and especially for our animal companions gathered with us here and at home. ***Amen.***

Finally, let us remember before God all in creation that have no voice and dwell in the wild of the mountains, the seas, the fields and forests. Let us remember especially all the animals and people who are without homes, the cold, the hungry, and those who are victims of deliberate or thoughtless mistreatment. ***Amen.***

Calling these our prayers to mind, let us pray together to the ruler of all creation, in the words which Jesus of Nazareth has taught us:

The Lord's Prayer

Officiant & People: ***Our Father, who art in heaven,
hallowed be thy Name,
thy kingdom come,
thy will be done,
on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread.
And forgive us our trespasses,
as we forgive those who trespass against us.
And lead us not into temptation,***

*but deliver us from evil.
For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory,
for ever and ever. Amen.*

The Readings

First Reading: *Excerpts from a letter Attributed to Chief Seattle
to the President of the United States, c. 1852*

Every part of the earth is sacred to my people. Every shining pine needle, every sandy shore, every mist in the dark woods, every meadow, every humming insect. All are holy in the memory and experience of my people.

The rivers are our brothers. They quench our thirst. They carry our canoes and feed our children. So you must give the rivers the kindness that you would give any brother.

This we know: the earth does not belong to man, man belongs to the earth. All things are connected like the blood that unites us all. Man did not weave the web of life, he is merely a strand in it. Whatever he does to the web, he does to himself.

One thing we know: our God is also your God. The earth is precious to him and to harm the earth is to heap contempt on its creator.

What will happen when the buffalo are all slaughtered? The wild horses tamed? What will happen when the secret corners of the forest are heavy with the scent of many men and the view of the ripe hills is blotted with talking wires? Where will the thicket be? Gone! Where will the eagle be? Gone! And what is to say goodbye to the swift pony and then hunt? The end of living and the beginning of survival.

The Confession:

Officiant: Let us humbly confess our sins against God, our neighbors, the animal kingdom, and the earth itself:

People: Almighty God, you have given us temporary lordship of your beautiful creation. But we have misused our power, turned away from responsibility and marred your image in us. Forgive us, true Lord, especially for our callousness and cruelty to animals. Help us to follow the way of Jesus of Nazareth, who expressed power in humility and lordship in loving service. Enable us, by your Spirit, to walk in newness of life, healing injury, avoiding wrong and making peace with all your creatures.

Officiants: May Almighty God grant us absolution and remission of all our sins, but also time for true repentance, amendment of life, and the grace and consolation of God's holy Spirit. **Amen.**

Second Reading: *Genesis 9:8-10, 12-15a, 16-17*

Then God said to Noah and to his sons with him, 'As for me, I am establishing my covenant with you and your descendants after you, and with every living creature that is with you, the birds, the domestic animals, and every animal of the earth with you, as many as came out of the ark. God said, 'This is the sign of the covenant that I make between me and you and every living creature that is with you, for all future generations: I have set my bow in the clouds, and it shall be a sign of the covenant between me and the earth. When I bring clouds over the earth and the bow is seen in the clouds, I will remember my covenant that is between me and you and every living creature of all flesh. When the bow is in the clouds, I will see it and remember the everlasting covenant between God and every living creature of all flesh that is on the earth.' God said to Noah, 'This is the sign of the covenant that I have established between me and all flesh that is on the earth.'

Third Reading: *Matthew 11:25-30*

Jesus said, "I thank you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, because you have hidden these things from the wise and the intelligent and have revealed them to infants; yes, Father, for such was your gracious will. All things have been handed over to me by my Father; and no one knows the Son except the Father, and no one knows the Father except the Son and anyone to whom the Son chooses to reveal him. Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light."

and the liveliness of flowers, and for the wonder of Your animal kingdom. We praise You for these good gifts, and pray that we may safeguard them for posterity. Grant that we may continue to grow in grateful enjoyment of Your abundant creation, to the honor and glory of Your Name, now and for ever. Amen.
