A TRADITIONAL SERVICE OF NINE LESSONS AND CAROLS FOR CHRISTMAS

The Festival of Nine Lessons and Carols was first celebrated at King's College, Cambridge, on Christmas Eve, 1918. It was an adaptation of a similar service that had been written for the cathedral at Truro in 1880. The lessons were reordered in 1919, and what follows are the lessons that have been used since that time. At King's College, the Festival is a Christmas Eve service, and the lessons, and music, move deliberately from the season of Advent into Christmastide. Many other parishes have adopted the tradition, occasionally modifying it as needed, and it is not unusual to omit a reading or two.



A Bidding Prayer







THE NINTH LESSON

St John unfolds the great mystery of the Incarnation

Celebrant Let us pray.


The Celebrant says the Collect.
